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## Foreword

FOR twenty-one years after its origin, in 1917, as a small hand-printing machine worked as a hobby by two amateur and not very competent printers, The Hogarth Press remained in the hands of its founders, Leonard and Virginia Woolf. During that time, and almost before they realized it, the Press grew into a publishing business with a staff, an office, and a yearly list of twenty or thirty books. In the spring of this year, however, Virginia Woolf retired from partnership, and her interests were taken over by John Lehmann. The sole partners in The Hogarth Press now, therefore, are Leonard Woolf and John Lehmann, but on literary questions they have the benefit of the advice of the following distinguished authors: W. H. Auden, Christopher Isherwood, Rosamond Lehmann, V. Sackville-West, Stephen Spender, and Virginia Woolf.
